Clear Horizons ECHS is listed in the 2017 *US News & World Report Gold* – 5th ECHS in Texas; 76th charter in the nation; 45th among all Texas high schools; 268th high school in the nation.

Clear Horizons ECHS is a culturally diverse school where 37% of the students qualify as economically disadvantaged and 16% of the students are identified as gifted and/or talented.

Our school is located on the campus of San Jacinto College South in a college building.

-  Our students begin attending college classes in the fall of their freshmen year.
-  All of our college classes are taught by San Jacinto College professors.
-  High school courses are Pre-Advanced Placement or Advanced Placement.
-  Our students earn a four-year high school diploma and a two-year associate degree in 4 years.
-  Our students are required to complete 20 hours of service learning each year and two professional internships during their junior and senior years.

Clear Horizons ECHS is a four year early college high school with an enrollment of approximately 450 students located on the San Jacinto College South Campus. Students begin college classes in the 9th grade with other college students instructed by college professors. Our students have been immersed in a college environment since the age of 14; therefore, they are able to interact appropriately with college professors and access college resources easily. An associate degree of 60 credit hours consists of a choice of approximately 130 dual credit courses offered at San Jacinto College South.

Clear Horizons ECHS students apply to Clear Horizons in 8th grade and are selected to attend based upon a lottery system. The vision of the school is to help populations that are traditionally under-represented in college earn 60 college credit hours and obtain a high school diploma in four years. Our ethnic diversity is 52% Caucasian, 31% Asian, 8% African American, 2.8% American Indian, .2% Pacific Islander, and 6% two or more, with 26% from Hispanic or Latino descent.
